Why read this?

This new social enterprise was set up by a young forestry student who wanted to promote forestry as a fantastic career for other young people - both men and women. Tree Sparks is a social enterprise on a mission to dispel the myths surrounding forestry and demonstrate that environmental careers are viable and hugely rewarding.

When the founder, Mima Letts was asked why "Tree Sparks" she said "The first is that Tree Sparks, although focused on forestry careers (I am a forester after all), wants to promote career options from all across the outdoor and environmental sector, from arboriculturalist, to environmental scientists, to foresters, and one of things these careers often have in common is trees!

The second is that I am only studying forestry and starting this enterprise because I love trees. Coming from the Fens, I grew up surrounded by solitary urban trees or those in hedgerows, not by vast forests. Almost all the people I talk to who are studying forestry or a related subject are doing it because they love trees and it is this passion and love for trees which I want to spread and share! It therefore seemed only fitting that the word Tree featured in our name."

What for?

- We Are A Social Enterprise We believe that the best way to run a business is do so for good.
- We Are Passionate About Trees We love talking about trees of every kind, and believe we should protect our natural environment.
- We Are Motivators We believe in opportunities for young people and do everything we can to motivate them towards success in the industry.
- We Are Youth Lead We believe in the 'power of youth' and that the best way for young people to make a difference in the industry is to speak up for what we believe in.
- Promote forestry careers to young people, whilst making forestry students more employable.
- Increase 15-19-year-olds awareness of forestry and environmental careers.
- Plan to run interactive workshops in schools using virtual reality technology.
- Plan to provide online resources including links, quizzes and videos.
